New Orleans Area Habitat for Humanity is building a new workforce housing and mixed-use community – Rising Oaks – on the Westbank of New Orleans in the Terrytown neighborhood of Jefferson Parish. Rising Oaks will be a walkable community conveniently located to healthcare, schools, childcare, employers, retail, restaurants, and critical services. The \$56 million project will showcase national best practices for development models that serve to enhance economic and social outcomes in aging suburban communities. The proposed Rising Oaks development will have a significant positive economic impact on the economy in Jefferson Parish, driving jobs, income, and tax revenue.

The project will break ground in early 2023 and be completed in three phases over 4 years, with an estimated build-out in late 2026.

Disaster Recovery: Long-Term Rebuilding and Home Repair Services



Partnering with the town of Jean Lafitte, Jefferson Parish, Rural Studio at Auburn University, Griffin Fishing Charters, and a host of sponsors for in-kind donations, New Orleans Habitat is helping the people of Jean Lafitte rebuild with homes that are designed to withstand the next storm. Rural Studio and New Orleans Habitat designed homes that are elevated 12', above the flood-levels faced during Hurricane Ida. The homes use coated metal siding so they do not need to be repainted and tankless water heaters. They are built to a Fortified Gold Standard and have a high energy efficiency rating in order to reduce the long-term cost of the home.

Our Home Repair Services program provides a variety of minor home repairs, interior, and exterior, acute damage, and daily wear and tear. This program helps low-income, elderly, and or disabled homeowners who may struggle to manage necessary repairs on their own.



Since 1983, New Orleans Habitat has build more than 760 homes and repaired more than 370 homes for hardworking New Orleans families in the New Orleans region.
